# Pool & Playground Rules

## Playground Rules

All rules will be strictly enforced by the Guard Staff for your safety.

Enforcement of the Playground Rules are the responsibility of the Guard Staff. Decisions pertaining to conduct are final.

1. No food or beverage in the playground area
2. Shoes must be worn
3. Cover ups must be worn
4. No horseplay
5. No running
6. No jumping from equipment
7. One rider only per swing
8. One person down the slide at a time, slide feet first only



## Pool & Playground Rules

### Pool Rules

Hours of operation, subject to change with out notice

1. Memorial Day - mid-August, Monday, 12 pm - 4 pm
2. Memorial Day - mid-August, Tuesday - Sunday, 11 am - 7 pm
3. Memorial Day - mid-August, Friday, 11 am - 8 pm
4. Mid-August - Labor Day, Tuesday - Thursday, 3 pm - 7 pm
5. Mid-August - Labor Day, Friday, 3 pm - 8 pm
6. Mid-August - Labor Day, Saturday & Sunday, 11 am - 7 pm

- The club management, pool manager and lifeguards have full authority to oversee the use of the pool and its operation. They will enforce the pool rules. Improper conduct or disobedience of rules will result in members being asked to leave the pool area.
- All members and guests must sign the register before entering the pool.
- A child shall not be permitted in the pool without a parent, a guardian or babysitter unless the child is a qualified swimmer. A qualified swimmer is considered qualified when he/she is able to swim one length of the pool. This test will be administered by the guards on duty. All children age twelve (12) and under, whether qualified swimmers or not, must be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or babysitter.
- A child must be able to swim the length of the main pool before being permitted to go into the diving well
- A member is allowed no more than two (2) guests per visit unless arranged in advance with the pool manager. A guest living within fifty (50) miles of the club house may be permitted to use the pool four (4) times within a calendar year. The member MUST accompany their guest to the pool for their entire stay, elderly may call for approval.
- Proper swim attire is required for entry to the pool, Cut-off shorts, boxer shorts, and gym shorts will not be permitted. Blue jeans are permitted on the pool deck, but not in the pool.
- No breakable bottles or glass containers of any kind will be permitted in the pool or bathhouse area.
- Parents are reminded that they are responsible for small children using the baby pool.

## Pool & Playground Rules

- No diapers are allowed. All children who are not toilet-trained shall wear swim diapers. No diapers in the baby pool.
- Pool parties must be pre-arranged with the banquet manager.
- Pursuant to the Illinois Swimming Pool Code, NO SMOKING is allowed on the pool deck.
- Running or pushing is not permitted at any time.
- Tag and other water games are not to be played in the diving well when it spoils the enjoyment or endangers the swimming of others.
- No pets are allowed in the pool or bathhouse area.
- No loitering in the bathroom.
- Swimmers must clear the pools and pool deck during weather warnings.
- Lane lines are in the water to accommodate lap swimmers. Lifeguards are responsible for keeping all leisure swimmers out of the lane lines. This is a safety issue as well as a consideration for lap swimmers.

\*GUEST FEES: Babysitters and nannies are not charged a guest fee. If parents accompany children/babysitter, the babysitter is considered a guest, and will be charged a guest fee and limited to four times within a calendar year. Dependent children, defined as 26 years or younger and living within the same house, are not considered guests. Grandchildren are not considered guests but must be at the pool with their grandparent. Any member with a legitimate need with regard to a babysitter has the right to petition the board for a special variance of this policy. This request must be in writing a General Manager. The board will consider these requests if any at their regular board meeting.
